KOAC COMPLETES 5KW EQUIPMENT TEST

MRS. ZELTA RODENWOLD, CHAIRMAN, KOAC PROGRAM STAFF, WRITES "THAT KOAC HAS COMPLETED ITS EQUIPMENT TEST ON 5000 WATSS AND SINCE JUNE 27 HAS BEEN ON THE 30-DAY PROGRAM TEST. WE ARE USING A DIRECTIONAL ANTENNA TO PROTECT THE TONGUE POINT NAVAL STATION IN THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE STATE. OUR SIGNAL NOW GETS INTO MORE OREGON TERRITORY THAN ANY OTHER OREGON STATION - AND IS AVAILABLE TO APPROXIMATELY 85 PER CENT OF THE STATE'S POPULATION."

IOWA ON MUTUAL AND NBC

CARL MENZER TELLS US THAT MUTUAL PICKED UP THREE PROGRAMS FROM THE IOWA CAMPUS DURING THE FINE ARTS FESTIVAL AND NBC CARRIED ONE. ON JULY 11, THE SUMMER SESSION SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA PRESENTED A CONCERT OVER NBS. A WEEK LATER, A PLAY WRITTEN BY DR. MARCUS BACH, INSTRUCTOR IN RELIGION AT IOWA WAS ON THE CIRCUIT AND ON JULY 25, MUTUAL CARRIED A PROGRAM BY THE UNIVERSITY CHORUS. NBC'S PROGRAM WAS A CONCERT BY THE SUMMER SESSION SYMPHONY, ON WHICH DR. PHILIP GREELEY CLASS, CONDUCTOR OF THE ORCHESTRA AND HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC, RECEIVED THE MAHLER MEDAL OF HONOR. HEARD THE NBC SHOW MYSELF AND CAN SAY IT WAS A GOOD ONE.

WNYC LISTS A NUMBER OF OUTSTANDING MUSICAL PERFORMANCES FOR JULY AND AUGUST, INCLUDING THE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA; NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC; GOLDMAN BAND; CITY AMATEUR SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA; NAUMBERG MEMORIAL CONCERTS; KATHERINE BACON; JULLIARD SUMMER FESTIVAL; AND ERNEST HUTCHESON; AND THE VICTORY CONCERTS.
